3:30 pm	<b>Beltane Music - an Afro Celtic Experience</b> <i>with Laurie Blue Heron and Fiona of Mami</i> <i>Wata</i> Do the drums call to your soul? Are you a musician? Do you love to sing? Whether you believe in More Cowbell or not, please join us as we put together the music we will play at the Beltane Ritual later today! Laurie Blue Heron will teach a simple West African rhythm and song that we will perform to gather the people in before the ritual begins. There will be parts for all levels of ability, and room left for individual creativity as well. Bring your own drum or rattle, clap your hands, or use the rhythm instruments provided. In the second half of this workshop period, we will learn the tune, lyrics and simple rhythm for the "Witches Reel", an authentic and magical Celtic song perfect for Maypole dancing. There is a simple guitar part for this song as well. Attendance at this workshop does not commit you to performance later, nor do you have to attend the workshop to play with us during ritual. - Ritual garb and/or brightly colored clothes, as well as a crown of flowers or greens for your head or bells for your feet, to wear during the Beltane ritual. Faerie, elven, pixie and fantasy garb are encouraged throughout the weekend and especially for the Beltane ritual Saturday evening.(optional)
- Contribution for potluck feast to feed at least two dozen, for Saturday lunch. For details, please see our Potluck Guidelines.
- Your own cup to use for drinks at meals and other times.
- Camping Gear: tent, sleeping bag, pillow, air mattress, flashlight, water jug, towel, biodegradable soap and shampoo, personal toiletries, sungear, raingear, cold weather gear, insect and tick repellent.
- A lawn chair, mat, or blanket for outdoor seating. Many activities will be outside.
- Yoga mat or meditation cushion for morning centering in the temple room (optional)
